

We are working towards a future without domestic violence! Our Prevention Education team engages with teens and adults to help build school-wide cultures based on consent. Through our classroom workshops, high school students are learning new skills in building equitable, authentic, and safe relationships. Plus, we provide nationally award-winning Confidential Advocacy services for students in all 9 Portland Public High Schools (alongside our partners at VOA Oregon Home Free), so teens can get the support they deserve in the face of dating and sexual violence.

We're proud to be a confidential and inclusive shelter where all survivors (along with their pets!) are welcome as they flee abuse. Our expert advocates work alongside families to help them get into safe housing and overcome challenges with accessing health care, parenting, basic needs, navigating the legal system, and more.

Our shelter and hotline are open 24/7, so there are always resources available for survivors seeking safety. This is especially vital since domestic violence is one of the leading causes of homelessness for women and children. 6,901 \*\*)

### **OUR EXTENSIVE PROGRAMMING OFFERS:**

- **Housing aid**: Rental and utility assistance, eviction prevention, and stability resources like tenant and financial education.
- **Holistic resources**: Support groups, case management, youth and family activities, safety planning, food and hygiene items, and more through our Advocacy Center.
- Domestic Violence Recovery Mentors: This survivor-led program, specializing in support for people at the intersection of domestic violence and addiction, is the first of its kind in Oregon. Mentors each have lived experience in both recovery and as survivors themselves, so they're uniquely able to provide a wide range of help to survivors as they transition from violence to safety. This could be anything from connecting with addiction treatment services to navigating family court systems to applying for jobs.
- **Health care advocacy**: Stationed at OHSU's Richmond Clinic, our advocate is able to meet with survivors in the safety of their doctor's office, while also providing training for staff.

### Survivor Feedback

We believe survivors are the experts in their lives and in what they need most. So every year we survey all our program participants at Raphael House, to learn about their experiences and adjust based on their input. Here's a glimpse at some of what was shared:


